Eligibility & Admission Requirements

- A bachelor's degree with a GPA of at least 3.0 or a master's degree with a GPA of at least 3.5
- NYS initial, professional, or permanent certification in Early Childhood Education, Childhood Education, PreK-Grade 6, TESOL, Middle Childhood (5-9), Adolescent (7-12) content teacher or Special Education
- Two letters of recommendation including one from a supervisor
- A statement of purpose
- An official Graduate Record Examination (GRE) score report

Qualified applicants are invited to participate in an interview and to provide an on-site writing sample.
